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What is an Independent Educational Evaluation (IEE)

An **IEE** is an evaluation of a child for the purposes of determining eligibility for a special education program that is performed by personnel outside the school system. It is your right and **you cannot be talked out of it.** You can also request one if you disagree with the 3-year reevaluation conducted by the school, the eligibility category or your child's placement.

You might pursue an IEE because of

- A belief that your child has a disability that the school does not identify;
- A belief that the school's evaluation of your child was inadequate;
- You feel that the school was incorrect regarding the following:
 - Whether your child should continue being identified as a special education student;
 - What handicapping condition is appropriate for your child (ex. Other Health Impaired (OHI) v. autism);
 - What type of services should be provided (ex. inclusion v. self-contained);
 - The appropriateness of the evaluation measures (were ADHD and/or Asperger Syndrome appropriately assessed);
 - o your child's present level of performance and/or annual goals; and
 - Their assessment of your child's academic progress toward the goals of increasing achievement (If they did not assess achievement).

The school personnel responsible for planning your child's educational program are required to consider the information presented in the IEE.

The district is required to pay for the IEE.
